- 1984 John Tosco began hosting music parties as informal gatherings in his home
- 1989 Songbooks document the first organized music parties
- 1997 TMP moved to an apartment clubhouse and started using sound systems
- 1998 Started renting venues: Derita American Legion, Neighborhood Theater, Great Aunt Stella Center
- 1999 Tosco Music Parties, Inc. became a 501c3 nonprofit organization
- 2001 Monthly Open Mic began as Tosco House Party at The Evening Muse
- 2002 TMP moved to McGlohon Theater at Spirit Square
- 2004 First Beatles Tribute Night at The Evening Muse
- 2006 TMP moved to Halton Theater at CPCC, Beatles Tribute moved to McGlohon Theater
- 2008 Celebrated 20 years of music parties (1989-2008)
- 2010 Awarded first Youth Music Scholarship to The Swannanoa Gathering  
Beatles Tribute moved to Knight Theater at Levine Center for the Arts
- 2014 TMP moved to Knight Theater
- 2015 Launched first Membership Program at the September TMP
- 2016 Tosco Music Open Mic celebrated 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary  
Launched Tosco Music's new brand, logo & website at the September TMP
